



Alvaro Cuervo-Cazurra is Professor of International Business and Strategy and the Lloyd Mullen Research Fellow at the D'Amore-McKim School of Business at Northeastern University. Before joining Northeastern he was a faculty member at the University of South Carolina and at the University of Minnesota, and visiting professor at Cornell University. He was the Patrick F. and Helen C. Walsh Research Professor and the Robert Morrison Research Fellow at the D'Amore-McKim School of Business, Northeastern University; John H. Dunning Fellow at Henley Business School, Reading University; Non-Resident Senior Research Fellow at the Institute for Emerging Market Studies, Moscow School of Management SKOLKOVO; and Honorary Member, Montreal Local-Global Research Group.

Professor Cuervo-Cazurra analyzes three topics in his research: the internationalization of firms, with a special interest in emerging market multinationals; capability upgrading, particularly technological capabilities; and governance challenges, focusing on corruption in international business. His seventy published research papers appear in leading academic journals, such as *Academy of Management Journal*, *Journal of International Business Studies*, *Research Policy*, *Strategic Management Journal*, and in edited books. He coedited the book *Understanding Multinationals from Emerging Markets*, and coauthored the book *Emerging Market Multinationals: Solving Operational Challenges in Internationalization*, both published by Cambridge University Press. His geographical area of expertise is Latin America. He has done fieldwork in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Mexico, Spain, and the US.

His research has received numerous awards. His dissertation at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology received the Free Press Best Dissertation Award from the Business Policy and Strategy Division of the Academy of Management, and was finalist for the Barry M. Richman Best Doctoral Dissertation Award from the International Management Division of the Academy of Management, and the Gunnar Hedlund Award for Best Dissertation in International Business from the Institute of International Business, Stockholm School of Economics and European International Business Association. A paper from his dissertation at the University of Salamanca received the best Ph.D. student paper award in strategy from the Academy of Management. Two of his papers received best paper awards from the Academy of Management's International Management division and one received a best paper award from the European International Business Academy.

He is the incoming co-editor of *Global Strategy Journal*, was reviewing editor of *Journal of International Business Studies* (2010-2016) and serves or has served on the editorial boards of other leading journals, such as *Journal of International Management*, *Journal of World Business*, *Organization Studies* and *Strategic Management Journal*. He guest edited special issues of *Journal of International Business Studies*, *Global Strategy Journal*, and *Journal of World Business*.

Professor Cuervo-Cazurra was elected a Fellow of the Academy of International Business in 2016. He was elected a Member of the Executive Committee of the Academy of Management's International Management Division (2012-2017) and is currently serving as Chair, was Chair of the Communications Committee of the Academy of Management's International Management Division (2008-2012), and was Representative-at-Large of the Strategic Management Society's Global Strategy Group (2006-2008). He has been Track Chair at the Academy of International Business Annual Meeting twice (2003, 2011), has co-organized the program of the Academy of International Business Latin American Chapter (2010), and has organized the professional development workshop program (2013) and the academic program (2014) of the International Management Division of the Academy of Management. He has received an outstanding service award from the Academy of International Business and six best reviewer awards.

Professor Cuervo-Cazurra teaches courses on global strategy and sustainability at the undergraduate, masters, executive and Ph.D. levels. He has taught at Northeastern University, University of South Carolina and University of Minnesota in the USA, IPADE and Monterrey Tec in Mexico, FGV and FDC in Brazil, Thammasat University in Thailand, University of Valencia in Spain, UNIS in Guatemala, WU in Austria, and Warsaw School of Economics in Poland. He was a finalist for professor of the year award at the University of South Carolina.

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
